The 42nd annual Yeltana Showjumping Championships will be held on April 16th and 17th, hosted by Kimba Pony Club and the Eyre Peninsula Showjumping Club.

A full programme of events will run over both days with three championship events on Sunday afternoon which will see local riders compete against some of the state's best competitors.

The Platinum Ag Services Under 21 Championship will run first for the juniors and is always a hotly contested event. This will be followed by the Agsave Merchandise 115cm Championship for horses with less than 60 points on their card.

Kimba IGA are again sponsoring the Arthur Whyte Memorial Senior Championship where the jumps get pretty high, in honour of the event's founder the late Mr Arthur Whyte.

Spectators are welcome with full catering all weekend.

The ever popular Calcutta, run on one of Sunday's Championship events, will be held after tea at the Kimba Pony Club shed on Saturday night with a BYO licence and music to finish off.

COUNCIL ADMINISTRATION OFFICE RENOVATIONS

Construction works to the Council Office are nearing completion, due to be finished mid-April. We thank you for your patience and co-operation with the disruptions during this process.

NEW STAFF MEMBER

COUNCIL WORK ACTIVITIES

South Terrace paving is nearing completion. This work included new kerbing, paving and re-planting of trees. Further to this the road surface will then be re-sealed.

Council will be undertaking re-sealing of sections on the Buckleboo Road and Railway Terrace during April. Please take care at these worksites when travelling through them.

Recent heavy rainfall over areas of our district has required numerous repairs to be completed. We have tried to prioritise these works and repair sections such as school bus routes, category 1 and 2 roads first. If you are aware of damaged road infrastructure please contact the council office so that it can be inspected and repaired.

KIMBA CEMETARY

Council would like to remind residents or family members wishing to erect a headstone or memorial in the Kimba Cemetery, that consent is required from the Council. This ensures that monuments comply with the rules & regulations of the Australian Standards AS 4204-1994. An application form can be obtained from the Council office.

REFUSE COLLECTION

To assist Council with litter control we ask residents to put waste in plastic bags prior to placing waste in their bins for collection. By doing this when the garbage truck unloads at the landfill site escaping litter is minimised, keeping the site tidy. Please ensure bins are placed 1 metre apart and in a position the garbage truck can reach them prior to kerbside collection.

DOG FINES

Council would like to remind residents of the policy for dogs and the fines that will incur if a dog is wandering at large, picked up by Council staff and/or delivered to the Dog Pound.

1. If the dog is registered and a first time offender the Wandering at Large Penalty will not be imposed, but there will be a \$30 per day (or part thereof) impoundment fee where applicable, and a warning given. The next time they will receive a Wandering at Large Fine of \$80.

2. If the dog is not registered and over 3 months old the owner will need to register the dog and pay the current fines legislated under the Dog & Cat Management Act which are:

- a. Registration fee: depending on type of dog (from \$10 - \$30)
- b. Penalty for not registered - \$80
- c. Penalty for Wandering at Large - \$80
- d. Impoundment fee where applicable - \$30 per day (or part thereof)

** Dogs will not be released back to the owner until the dog has been registered and/or any penalties paid**

ANZAC DAY

April 25th was officially named ANZAC Day in 1916, the first anniversary of the landing of Australian and New Zealand Army Corps on the Gallipoli Peninsula in Turkey during World War I. The Gallipoli battle established the ANZAC tradition of courage, determination and mateship.

On Monday 25th April Kimba will honour Anzac Day with the traditional march along High Street from Landmark to the Memorial Cross Garden at 11 am. Anyone with relatives who have served or are currently serving in the military forces is welcome to join the march, assemble at the Landmark corner at 10.45am.

A Church service will follow in the Town Hall after which a pooled lunch will be held in the RSL Clubrooms. Everyone is welcome to bring along food and join members in an afternoon of comradeship.

BUSHFIRE MANAGEMENT - BURNING PERMIT GUIDELINES

Council would like to remind residents of the permit guidelines for burning off in the Kimba district.

The Bushfire Danger Season for the Kimba District Area is until the 30th of April 2016.

1. Permits will be issued from the 1st Monday in February 2016 and burning will not be undertaken with a Fire Index

of 25 or greater as per attached sheet except for the following:-

- A) Permits required for CFS Training
 - B) Other at discretion of Fire Prevention Officer.
2. Permits will only be issued for a maximum of one week (Council Staff) and one month (CFS Captains).
 3. Burning is not to be commenced until a physical copy has been received.
 4. The time for lighting of fires for burning off be no earlier than 10 am, day light saving time or at the discretion of the authorised officer.
 5. That these permits are issued only for burning grasses, stubble and heaps of grass type litter.
 6. Burning is prohibited on Saturdays, Sundays and Public Holidays at all times.
 7. The issue of permits for grain dryers exempt the condition of the Fire & Emergency Services Regulations 2005 Section 33(5)(a)(c)(d).
 8. The users of Allora Field Bin Dryers may be exempt of Section 33(5)(a)(c)(d) of the Fire & Emergency Services Regulations 2005, by the endorsement on their permit by the Fire Prevention Officer providing that a minimum of 400 Litres of water connected to an engine driven pump on a mobile unit is at hand and the operator on site.
 9. All other permit conditions applied to Permits must be adhered to.
 10. There must be 400 Litres of water connected to a pump driven by an internal combustion engine in the paddock area where burning is to occur.

PERMIT NOTIFICATION

The following must be notified of the intention to light a fire:

2. Department of Environment, Water and Natural Resources if burning if within one

kilometer of a national park (phone 8648 1883 and leave a message if office unattended)

3. Your neighbour's
4. Adelaide Fire – 8204 3782
5. The Area CFS Captain:

Robert Dart – Yalanda James 0427871733
Trevor Clifford – Kimba 0414422217
Graham Baldock (acting) – Buckleboo 0447282622.


Each and every day, at least two hours prior to lighting a fire for the burning of grass, stubble or heaps of material. Administration staff will then notify Region 6 of the burn off.

The notification must include the name of the permit holder, the permit number, the location (i.e. Section and Hundred) and time of lighting.

NOTE: Any Permit issued may be revoked at any time by an Authorised Officer if conditions are considered too dangerous for burning off operations. South Australian Police will be notified of any breaches to permit conditions or burning without an appropriate permit.

GREEN ARMY ON THE ADVANCE IN THE KIMBA AREA

Workskil Australia's Green Army team is partnering with the Middleback Alliance to provide protection for a range of threatened plants, birds and mammal species at the Secret Rocks Nature Reserve.

The Secret Rocks Nature Reserve is managed by the Middleback Alliance, a partnership between landholders and DEWNR in the Kimba-Whyalla region.

The reserve is home to populations of Malleefowl, Sandhill Dunnarts, and Chalky Wattles, all of which have conservation status. The project is managed by landholders John Read and Katherine Moseby, two experienced ecologists who have been closely involved with other conservation efforts in the arid zone of South Australia.

Through managing the reserve it has become apparent that the presence of a number of grazing species, both native and introduced, is seriously impacting the productivity of the local habitat. The severity of that impact has been highlighted by the construction of several trial enclosures which show how well and how many plant species can recover when that grazing pressure is removed.

Workskil Australia is seeking participants aged 17 to 24, to undertake this 22 week Green Army project. The team will work with the Middleback Alliance to build two enclosures that will allow the local flora to recover and in so doing provide habitat for fauna species like the Malleefowl and Sandhill Dunnart. While building the fence the team will also assist in surveys to monitor Malleefowl numbers in the area and what small marsupials and reptiles are present as well. They'll also be involved in pest management activities to control foxes, cats and weeds on the reserve.

As part of the program the team will get accreditation in the form of a ChemCert certificate, as well as training in fence construction and other conservation and land management modules. Participants are entitled to a training allowance and are provided with protective clothing as a part of their participation. Kimba will be the preferred location for basing the team during the program.

Chief Executive Officer of Workskil Australia, Ms Nicole Dwyer, said the program was helping unemployed youth to prepare for sustainable ongoing employment.

"Through practical training, young people are attaining relevant qualifications in areas such as land management, park management, landscaping or horticulture, as well as certification in first aid and workplace health and safety," she said.

Special Meeting of the Kimba Show Society to Change Ownership of Community Gym

The Kimba AH & F Society has been approached by the Kimba Health and Fitness Committee to hand over ownership of the pavilion section used as the gym to that group.
